

#### Kingston Musicians' Union Donates \$955

Molly Brant Elementary School saw a huge boost to their instrumental program in February with a donation from the Musicians Union from a Memorial Scholarship Fund and a Musicounts grant from CARAS. The union donation came from the Dick Baldwin Memorial Scholarship Fund. "The memorial fund had the money left over and the board felt that it was a great way to encourage young musicians in the community" Sue Moore, secretary and treasurer with the KMU said "the donation will help to buy two instruments for the program". "When it came time to decide what to do with the money left over in the fund it was a unanimous decision to donate it to the school music program. " It's more than a music program" Moore said. "For some of these students, it opens doors, builds confidence, improves their social skills and it has far reaching consequences than just teaching music, in some cases it can be life changing." " Circumstances make it difficult for some students to obtain instruments, so the school has tried to build the instrument inventory so that every student has access to an instrument. Currently they are sharing instruments at a ratio of 3:1"

"Music is one piece of your life in school" Principal Michael Blackburn said to the students. "We want every single one of you to have every possibility that can possibly happen in your lives, whether it's in school or outside of school. "

#### MUSICIANS PENSION FUND CANADA

\*\*\*\*\*

Section 4.01. Vesting Service. A Member shall be credited with one month of Vesting Service for each month in which he is a Member of the Plan. Section 4.02. Vested Status. (a) An Employee who becomes a Member of the Plan after December 31, 2000 acquires immediate Vested Status. (b) Any Member of the Plan who has Contributions made on his behalf after December 31, 2000, acquires immediate Vested Status. (c) An Employee who becomes a Member of the Plan prior to January 1, 2001 and does not have any Contributions made on his behalf after December 31, 2000, acquires Vested Status on the earliest date that one of the following requirements is met: (i) he has accumulated at least 24 months of Vesting Service; or (ii) he has attained Normal Retirement Age while still a Member of the Plan.

### **ABOUT MPTF**

The Music Performance Trust Fund (MPTF) was established in 1948 as a nonprofit independent public service organization whose mission includes contributing to the public knowledge and appreciation of music, as well as making music a part of every child's life experience. Headquartered in New York City, the tax-exempt MPTF, operating under section 501(c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code, evolved from a landmark collective bargaining agreement between the American Federation of Musicians and the major recording companies of the day.

Funded via a royalty stream from the signatory record labels, led by the three major labels, Sony Music Entertainment, Universal Music Group, and the Warner Music Group, the MPTF today presents thousands of live, admission-free musical programs annually in the United States and Canada.

Working in tandem with union locals in various cities, the MPTF places <u>music in the schools</u>, with priority given to music that enhances education and affords students an opportunity to enjoy live music and interact with professional musicians.

#### Music in the Schools

As music programs in schools continue to decline, the Music Performance Trust Fund has been increasing its support and commitment in this area. At present, approximately 35% of available funds are earmarked for in-school programming. The MPTF is proud to co-sponsor programs that not only present live music to the children, but also incorporate historic, instrumental and theoretical workshops. To con-



tinue its funding of these invaluable programs, MPTF is broadening its local and

nationwide search for philanthropic support . In Kingston we have benefitted from this program on many occasions . At a Recent MPTF sponsored event, Molly Brant Elementary School hosted the annual Band Bash with conductor John Palmer . This event is just one of the examples of funding that we have received from this excellent program.

#### MusicianFest The Music Performance Trust

Fund has a long-standing tradition of providing music entertainment for senior citizens. Although older enthusiasts enjoy our park events, community concerts, and symphonic performances, we have strived to connect more deeply and more intimately with our aging

population, who face growing economic, mobility, and social challenges. In 2015, the MPTF developed a program called MusicianFest as an umbrella covering free senior centre performances. Our goal was a lofty one, to initiate 500 solo musician performances across North America. We enlisted the assistance of the National Council On Aging and their National Institute of Senior Centres to help source quality locations where there was a need for support and stimulus for their senior communities. In Kingston we have received three MusicianFest grants.

Notes: We have very few assets, we pay very little for the office, heating, electricity, internet, monitor, printer, storage, filing cabinets, desk, and all other office furniture are all supplied by the Moore's. In 2016 we improved our financial situation ending the year with approximately \$6,000 more in our accounts than in 2015.

At the end of 2015 we had \$19,000 in our bank account and less than \$500 in our Paypal account FYI: keeping the union office running efficiently requires 25-30 hours per week

## School Music Program gets a Boost



The band program began 9 years ago as part of the Limestone District School Board Partnership in Music at Frontenac Public School when a grant to provide the school with a full set of band instruments made it possible for the students to take regular instrument lessons weekly. The program was so successful that

when the school found out it was to be amalgamated to form the new school, Molly Brant, the grade 7/8 staff and Principal made sure that all students were given the same opportunities to be part of the instrumental program as their former participants. "The increase in the number of students to 75 has made it difficult to meet the demands and needs of such a large program." Moore explained

Despite the existence of Joe Mills lending library it was found that many of the families attending Molly Brant were unable to take advantage of this resource due to the nature of their circumstances. The school has made it their goal to have enough instruments in their inventory so that every student has an instrument for their use while attending grade 7 and 8. The budget needed for this goal is estimated at approximately \$32,000. In the fall Sue Moore applied for a CARAS grant of \$10,000 which would cover a third of the cost. Last Wednesday Sue heard that she was successful in obtaining the Musicounts grant so along with the money from the Dick Baldwin Scholarship they are a third of their way to achieving their goal.

David Smith and Gene Richard were both in attendance at the presentation. "I think this is an ideal situation in terms of getting musical instruments to the kids at this age" said David Smith, the Local's President . "It's really very important". David told the students that he started playing the Saxophone at age 14 when he put his hand up for volunteers to play the instrument.

"Programs like these are unique and need to be encouraged. Unfortunately they require funds to keep them active and purchasing the instruments is only the first step. The instruments need to be properly maintained and an interest in the program needs to remain strong to survive. So far we have had great support from the staff, the principals and the community, that's why it felt right to invest in their future." SM

# This is my Canada!

## Jeanette Arsenault

affectionately known as Dream Team Canada, have adopted Jeanette Arsenault's patriotic bilingual song "This Is My Canada / Mon Cher Canada" as a song to express their national pride.

The song and accompanying HD music video is being launched in time for Canada Day and features some of Canada's finest session players and Canadian Artists who are the Dream Team Canada Singers with a combined 6 Grammy and 13 Juno Awards. It also includes stunning visuals of the vast Canadian landscape.

A very special appearance by 12 year old Malakai Daybutch, one of Canada's brilliant and sought-after traditional indigenous dancers, created magic. His presence, spirit, friendship and contribution were riveting and emotional.

Both Arsenault and Coleman are community-minded and are organizing a campaign that will raise funds for Canadian registered charities (to be announced upon the launch) through sales and licensing of the song+video across Canada and around the world.

This grassroots campaign has captured the imagination of Canadians from coast to coast who have heard it over the years and urged Arsenault to launch it nationally as Canada's national song right along side Canada's national anthem.

A documentary that represents the story of this national song and all of its grassroots elements called "The Making of This Is My Canada / Mon cher Canada," is being created and will be submitted to Netflix, cable networks and film festivals globally.

Jeanette Arsenault wrote her anthemic This Is My Canada/Mon cher Canada 25 years ago and when presented with having to make a lifestyle decision, she chose to put the song on the shelf to become a full time mother/ part time performer.

The song became the little song that could - over the years, she had just enough interesting gigs that encouraged her to keep nursing it along. She sang it at various events across Canada, including for HRH Queen Eliza-

beth II during her "walkabout"; for the Canadian Olympic Team in Salt Lake City and again in Athens Greece; for the Olympic Torch Relay in Picton ON; on a train across western Canada as VIA Rail Artist on Board; for the Pan Am Torch Relay in Trenton; just to name a few.

She continues to write and perform with a current focus on all things Canadian - including collaborations with other artists on a tribute to the Canadian soldiers who fought at Vimy Ridge as well as another project which is a tribute to Canadian women in song. JeanetteArsenault.ca
